B.A Music -Vocal

1. DURATION OF THE PROGRAM

1.1 THREE YEARS (SIX semesters)

1.2 Each academic year shall be divided into two semesters. The odd semesters shall consist of the period from June to November of each year and the even semesters from December to April of each year.

1.3 There shall be no less than 90 working days for each semester.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

2.1 A CANDIDATE WHO HAS PASSED ONE OF THE EXAMINATIONS MENTIONED BELOW SHALL BE PERMITTED TO APPEAR AND QUALIFY FOR THE B. A DEGREE EXAMINATION OF THIS UNIVERSITY

a) The Candidate should have passed the Higher Secondary (+2) Examination of the Government of Tamil Nadu.

b) The Candidate should have passed PUC/inter under 11 +1 pattern of education.

THE ADMISSION OF A CANDIDATE IS CONFIRMED ONLY AFTER AN INTERVIEW OFFLINE / ONLINE FOR INDIAN AND FOREIGN STUDENTS RESPECTIVELY.

3. CREDIT REQUIREMENTS AND ELIGIBILITY FOR AWARD OF BACHELORS DEGREE

3.1 A Candidate shall be eligible for the award of the Degree only if he/she has undergone the prescribed course of study in a College affiliated to the University for a period of not less than THREE academic years and passed the examinations of all the SIX Semesters prescribed earning a minimum of 150 credits as per the distribution given in Regulation for Part I, II, III, IV, V & VI and also fulfilled such other conditions as prescribed thereof in Annexure I.

4. COURSE OF STUDY AND SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

Admission to the UG course is confirmed only after the interview and on confirmation of admission fees may be remitted. Non-payment of fees before the stipulated time (15 days from the date of joining) will lead to cancellation of admission.

4.1 Eligibility: Students shall be eligible to go to subsequent semesters only if they earn sufficient attendance as prescribed therefore by the Syndicate from time to time.

4.2 Attendance: All Students must earn 75% and above of attendance for appearing for the University Examination (Theory/Practical)

- 4.3 Condonation of shortage of attendance:** If a Student fails to earn the minimum attendance (Percentage stipulated), the Principals shall condone the shortage of attendance up to a maximum limit of 10% (ie. between 65% and above and less than 75%) after collecting the prescribed fee of Rs. 250/-each for Theory/Practical examination separately, (Theory Rs.250/- Per semester/Per Student: Practical Rs.250/- Per semester/Per Student towards the Condonation of shortage of attendance, Such fees are collected and should be remitted to the University. Only upon payment of the prescribed fees, the student may be allowed to appear for the exam for both practical and theory papers
- 4.4 Non-eligibility for Condonation of shortage of attendance:** Students who have secured less than 65% but more than 50% of attendance are NOT ELIGIBLE for Condonation of shortage of attendance and such Students will not be permitted to appear for the regular examination, but will be allowed to proceed to the next year/next semester of the program and they may be permitted to take next University examination by paying the prescribed Condonation fee of Rs 250/ each for Theory/Practical separately. Such fees shall be remitted to the University. Name of such Students should be forwarded to the University along with their attendance details in the prescribed format mentioning the category [3 copies) Year wise/Branch wise/Semester wise together with the fees collected from them, so as to enable them to get permission from the University and to attend the Theory/Practical difficulty. examination subsequently without any.
- 4.5 Detained students for want of attendance:** Students who have earned less than 50% of attendance shall be permitted to proceed to the next semester and to complete the Program of study. Such Students shall have to repeat the semester, which they have missed by rejoining after completion of final semester of the course, by paying the fee for the break of study as prescribed by the University from time to time.
- 4.6 Condonation of shortage of attendance for married women students:** In respect of married women students undergoing UG programs, the minimum attendance for Condonation (Theory/Practical) shall be relaxed and prescribed as 55% instead of 65% if they conceive during their academic career. Medical certificate from the Doctor (D.G.O) attached to the Government Hospital and the prescribed fee of Rs.250/-there for together with the attendance details shall be forwarded to the university to consider the Condonation of attendance mentioning the category.
- 4.7 Zero Percentage (0%) Attendance:** The Students, who have earned 0% of attendance, have to repeat the program [by rejoining) without proceeding to succeeding semester and they have to obtain prior permission from the University immediately to re join the program
- 4.8 Transfer of Students and Credits:** The strength of the credits system is that it permits inter Institutional transfer of students. By providing mobility, it enables Individual students to develop their capabilities fully by permitting them to move from one Institution to another in accordance with their aptitude and abilities.
- 4.9** Transfer of Student is permitted from one institution to another Institution for the same program with same nomenclature.
- 4.10** Provided there is a vacancy in the respective program of Study in the Institution where the transfer is requested.
- 4.11** The marks obtained in the courses will be converted to grades and GPS will be assigned as per the University norms.
- 4.12** Students who want to go to foreign Universities upto two semesters or Project Work with the prior approval of the Departmental/College Committee are allowed to get transfer of credits and marks which will be converted into Grades as per the University norms and are eligible to get CGPA and Classification

6. Procedure for Awarding Internal Marks

6.1 THEORY PAPER- Two Internal Assessments may be conducted over a period of one semester, each test in a span of 25 days and average of two may be taken as the internal marks for the theory paper. In case the students feel they have improved and would be able to score better or in case of valid personal health reasons they were unable to attend the internals on the specified date, they may be allowed a third internal assessment (only when requested by the students themselves) and the best two may be considered for the internal assessment marks for the course paper.

6.2 PRACTICAL PAPER-Two Internal Assessments may be conducted over a period of one semester, each test in a span of 25 days marked for 20 each and the total (20+20-40) be taken as internal marks for the practical papers. In case the students feel they have improved and would be able to score better or in case of valid personal health reasons they were unable to attend the internals on the specified date, they may be allowed a third internal assessment (only when requested by the students themselves) and the best two may be considered for the internal assessment marks for the course paper.

Questions must be asked from each of the units ensuring the students have covered the entire syllabus and marks to be awarded accordingly

8. INSTANT EXAMINATION

Instant Examinations is conducted for the students who appeared in the final semester examinations of the UG degree Courses. Eligible criteria for appearing in the Instant Examinations are as follows:

- i. Eligibility: A Student who is having arrear only in one theory paper in the final semester examination of the UG Degree program is eligible to appear for the Instant Examinations.
- ii. Non eligibility for one Arrear Paper, A Student who is having more than one arrear paper in the current appearance of Fourth Semester for UG Examinations is not eligible for appearing for the Instant Examinations.
- iii. Non eligibility for Arrear in other semester Student having arrear in any other semester is not eligible and a candidate who is absent in the current appearance is also not eligible for appearing in the Instant Examinations and those Students who have arrear in Practical/Project are not eligible for the Instant Examinations.
- iv. Non eligibility for those who completed the programme: Students who have completed their Program duration but having arrears are not eligible to appear for Instant Examinations
- v. RETOTALLING, REVALUATION AND PHOTOCOPY OF THE ANSWER SCRIPT

Retotaling:UG Students are not eligible to apply for retotaling of their answer script.

Revaluation: All current batch students who have appeared for their Semester Examinations are alone eligible for Revaluation of their answer scripts, passed out students are not eligible for Revaluation.

Photocopy of the answer scripts: Students who have applied for revaluation can download their answer scripts from the University Website after fifteen days from the date of publication of the results though the availability of this option will be intimated.

9. CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

9.1 Students who secured not less than 60% of aggregate marks (Internal External) in the whole examination shall be declared to have passed the examination in the First Class All other successful Students shall be declared to have passed in Second Class Candidates who obtain 75% of the marks in the aggregate (Internal External) shall be deemed to have passed the examination in First Class with Distinction, provided they pass all the examinations (theory papers, practical, project and viva- voce) prescribed for the course in the First appearance.

10. GRADING SYSTEM

10.1 Minimum Credits to be earned For THREE-year Program

- 150 Credits in total
- 75 Credits and 40 (Core and Electives respectively)
- 25 Credits (including both Languages and Project/ Internship)

10.2 Marks and Grades

GPA (Grade Point Average) for a Semester:

GPA= Sum of the multiplication of grade points (0-9 as given in the above table) by the credits of the courses in a semester / Sum of the credits of the courses in a semester.

11. RANKING

Students who pass all the examinations prescribed for the program in the first appearance itself are alone eligible for Ranking, provided in the case of candidates who pass all the examinations prescribed for the program with a break in the First Appearance due to the reasons as furnished in the Regulations are only eligible for Classification. The students who have come under transfer are also eligible for Ranking provided they have been transferred from one institution to another affiliated to the same University and same regulations.

12. CONCESSIONS FOR DIFFERENTLY-ABLED STUDENTS

Dyslexia students For students who are mentally disabled, having disability and mental retardation, who are slow learners, who are mentally impaired having learning disorder and seizure disorder and students who are spastic and cerebral Palsy, the following concessions shall be granted. Provided the request is duly certified by the Medical Board of the Government Hospital General Hospital/ District headquarters Hospitals.

- One-third of the time of paper as extra time in the examination
- Leniency in overlooking spelling
- Amanuensis for all PG programmes provided the request is duly certified by the Medical Board of the Government Hospital/ General Hospital/ District headquarters Hospitals and they shall be declared qualified for the degree if they pass the other examinations prescribed for the degree

13. Visually Challenged Students

Exempted from paying examination fees. A scribe shall be arranged by the college and the scribe be paid as per the college decision.

14. MAXIMUM PERIOD FOR COMPLETION OF THE PROGRAMS TO QUALIFY FOR A DEGREE

A Student who for whatever reasons is not able to complete the programme within the normal period (N) or the Minimum duration prescribed for the programme, may be allowed two years beyond the normal period to clear the backlog to be qualified for the degree (Time Span N+ 2 years for the completion of the programme).

In exceptional cases like major accidents and childbirth, an extension of one year can be considered beyond maximum span of time (Time Span N2+1 years for the completion of programme). Students qualifying during the extended period shall not be eligible for RANKING.
